What is the Hampshire STP?

Paul O'Beirne spoke about how the stresses and pressures the NHS face have been highlighted in the media recently, especially older persons care and financial matters. Paul asked if everyone at the Forum knows what 'STP' means? He explained that it means 'Sustainability Transformation Programme'.

Paul then introduced Darren Hargreaves from the Hampshire & I.O.W STP (giving presentation prepared by colleague Richard Samuel who sent his apologies).

Questions were invited following the presentation;

Q: Physical & Mental Health Alliance – how will they engage and who will they be accountable to?

A: Any plans of the STP will be put to consultations at a set stage. Ultimately we would need to fulfil a pre-consultation business case first. Elizabeth Kerwood said that the MCP is already looking at mental health. Darren clarified that the STP is not an organisation, it is a collaboration, a vehicle for transformation.

Q: 20 years ago the NHS planned to digitalise all its records, this came to nothing other than wasted time and money. Why will you be more successful?

A: You are right, the program you referred to had lots of different versions, it did come to something, but not where they hoped. Organisations have issues sharing your information. Hants & IOW STP are already around the table discussing how we can share the information and have you agree.

Update on MCP including Frailty Group & Portfolio Group

Paul O'Beirne asked if everyone knows what 'MCP' means? He explained it means 'Multispecialty Community Provider'.

Paul then introduced Kerry Cooper – Manager of the MCP Project

Questions were invited following the presentation;

Q: The Hub's activities: How many patients will qualify?

A: We will look at the activity data. We can track the data of people using the emergency department for example, whether they are admitted or not.

Q: What about if hospitals are too full?

A: People will still be registered on the database as having attended hospital, even if not admitted and sent home.

Q: Most people can't get to see their GP, how will you stop inappropriate visits to A&E?

A: Quite often people don't get to see the same GP, or their own GP at their practice, particularly for same day appointments. Patients have reported back that if they really need to see a GP same day they are not too concerned about having to see their own GP. All Doctors will be able to see your medical records, these can be on the system at the hub, as long as you have agreed to this.
